Associate Director Updates

4-H Introduces NEW Uniform Guidelines

In early 2014, we had a 4-H uniform contest for members to submit their design ideas for a new 4-H uniform. Entries were chosen, following specific criteria that were about accessibility, affordability, brand-ability and identity. In early summer 2014, youth and adults voted and commented on the designs presented. The voting period ended a year ago and since then the 4-H Incentives and Recognition Advisory Committee (I & R) has reviewed, discussed and dissected the voting results.

We are pleased to announce that the California 4-H Youth Development Program has adopted new 4-H uniform guidelines. Implementation of these guidelines are effective beginning July 1, 2015 and are expected to take several years for full adoption. See the 4-H uniform page on the state website for more information and see the California 4-H Uniform Guidelines for complete garment details and the transition plan to the new uniform guidelines.

The uniform is made up of the following garments:

- 1. Official green 4-H hat branded with the University of California, Agriculture and Natural Resources (UC ANR) and the 4-H clover logo mark. Senior members who are already in a white hat will be able to keep wearing the white hat for the remainder of their 4-H career. Newly branded 4-H hats can be purchased through Leslie Carman 4-H Supplies as of August 31, 2015.
- 2. A plain white shirt with a collar. Any length of sleeve, including sleeveless is acceptable. Alternate Casual Uniform: For casual events, members may wear their club or county t-shirt, without the hat, provided that t-shirt has the proper use of the 4-H emblem according to the California 4-H Branding Toolkit.
- 3. Members have a choice of bottoms, appropriate to the event or activity, as specified in the California 4-H Dress Guidelines.
- 4. OPTIONAL: A traditional 4-H tie or scarf worn with the collared white shirt. The tie and scarf are both worn under the collar. Any member can wear either the scarf or the tie--whatever the member is most comfortable wearing. These can be purchased through Leslie Carman 4-H Supplies.

And as a reminder--There is no uniform requirement in the 4-H YDP and a uniform cannot be required for participation in any 4-H YDP sponsored activity, event, meeting or occasion.

2015 CA State Horse Classic

The 2015 State 4-H Horse Classic is in the books, and overall the event was a huge success! The week-long event took place at Brookside Equestrian Show Park in Elk Grove, California from June 23-28, 2015. In addition to the traditional horse show classes, 4-H youth members also participated in a variety of equine related educational contests. Over 125 youth members registered for the horse show and over 35 youth members registered for the educational contests.

This year's educational contests consisted of horse judging, hippology, horse bowl, demonstrations, and prepared speeches. Throughout participation in these contests, youth were able to expand their equine knowledge, develop leadership and



citizenship skills, experience personal growth, and establish lifelong friendships with other youth members throughout California. The top four senior individuals in horse judging, hippology, and horse bowl, as well as the top individuals in prepared speaking and demonstrations qualified to represent California at the Western National Roundup in Denver, Colorado in January of 2016.

In addition to the educational contests, a variety of horse show classes were offered. This year we offered Western, English, Trail, Gymkhana, and Over Fences classes. We also offered miniature horse classes which included: Showmanship, Trail, Jumping, Bi-rangle, Pole Bending, and Single Stake. A High Point award, in the form of a belt buckle, was awarded to the exhibitor with the most points in each division. The Reserve High Point winner in each division was awarded an embroidered duffle bag with the 4-H Horse Classic logo. The National 4-H Salute to Excellence Volunteer Recognition Award recognizes 4-H volunteers who demonstrate exemplary service to 4-H, while promoting service through volunteerism as both an opportunity and a privilege. 



Scientific literacy: California 4-H defines it from citizens' perspective

OJJDP Updates National DMC Data to Statistical Briefing Book

The OJJDP Statistical Briefing Book (SBB) has added new features to its National Disproportionate Minority Contact (DMC) Databook. This application presents the national DMC data for the juvenile justice system and their Relative Rate Index Matrices that quantify levels of racial disparity introduced at various decision points within the system. This update provides data through 2013 and makes available new features, including:

- DMC tables for combinations of gender and race for juvenile court stages.
- Tables comparing males to females for juvenile arrest and court stages.

Developed by the National Center for Juvenile Justice, the research division of the National Council of Juvenile and Family Court Judges, SBB offers easy online access to statistics on a variety of juvenile justice topics.

Science education research has demonstrated the influence of affect on learning. The National 4-H Science Logic Model outlines outcomes from youth participation in 4-H science programs, which includes attitude and interest outcomes. The associated measure, the National 4-H Science Common Measure, assesses these attitude constructs and not other affective factors. Tie study reported here sought to determine whether additional affective constructs were separate from the general constructs assessed on the Common Measure. We found the additional measures have good reliability and moderate correlations among the outcomes, suggesting the new measures assess different constructs than currently assessed by the Common Measure.

TechXcite is an engineering-focused, discovery-based after-school science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM) program. The free curriculum is downloadable from http://techxcite.pratt.duke.edu/ and is comprised of eight Modules, each with four to five 45minute activities that exercise the science and math learned in school by using engineering principles to build products or learn processes that improve the quality of life. Ninety-eight percent of TechXcite instructors indicated that students learned and demonstrated improved competence in science and engineering. TechXcite Modules include building prosthetic arms, infrared remote controls, solar-powered cars, harvesting rain water, and imaging biological systems.

2014-2015 4-H Annual Financial Reporting & System Features

The 4-H Unit Annual Financial Reporting system opened on July 1st, for county staff and 4-H units to begin logging in and entering their 2014-2015 4-H financial reporting information.

- \Rightarrow State deadline for 4-H units to submit all required financial reporting forms is **September 15th**. State deadline for county office to confirm all unit reports submitted is November 1st. See Webinar 5 and 6.12.15 webinar for review of the online financial system navigation and use by units and staff.
- ⇒ A series of reminder letters is available for county staff to use in communicating reminders of the required end of the year reporting due from 4-H units. Treatment Authorization Form clarifications

At the bottom of the youth and adult volunteer treatment authorization forms in the enrollment packets, there is language that reads, "You have the right to review University records containing personal information about you, with certain exceptions as set forth in policy and statute. Copies of University policies pertaining to the collection, use, or release or personal data are available for your examination from the local UCCE County Director, 4-H Youth Development Advisor, 4-H Program Representative or the Associate Director of 4-H Program & Policy..."
