Dr. Alyx DeBenedetto - Equine Chiropractor

Dr. Alyx DeBenedetto became interested in chiropractic after sustaining a horseback riding injury at the early age of 13 years old. Francesca Baron- Horse Breaking and Training of Reining a Cow Horses

Francesca Baron was born in Vicenza, a city in the north east of Italy.

Supported by her family, her passion for horses began at 6 years old when she got her first horse.

In 1988, she started showing in the AQHA of Italy Performance Youth disciplines like horsemanship, showmanship, hunter under saddle, hunter hack, western pleasure, trail, and hunt seat equitation.

In 1990, at the age of 12, she was selected to compete with the Italian team at the Youth Quarter Horse World Cup in Calgary, Canada, as well as in 1994 at the Youth Quarter Horse World Cup in Germany. She was trained by Paola Donarini and Filippo Masi until she graduated from high school. Then her passion became her job working for both Italian (Filippo Masi, Gianluca Marchesini) and American horse trainers (Don Boyd, Todd Crawford, and John Ward). During this time she also studied to become an NRHA, NRCHA and NCHA judge.

In 2005, she built her own little ranch on her family's property in Torreselle near Vicenza and began showing reining, cutting and Cow Horses. During this time, her passion for the Cow Horse focused her efforts into promote this discipline in Italy and Europe where she was the Vice President of the European Reined Cow Horse Association. She was the first woman in Europe to win the European Cow Horse Futurity in 2013. Currently Francesca is working for NRCHA Million Dollar Rider Jon Roeser in Lemoore, CA.

Francesca Baron is a NRHA judge, NRCHA judge, a worldwide 1A judge for NCHA, and a level 2 Reining instructor for the Italian Federation of Equine Sports. She was the 2007 ERHA Limited Open Champion, and Reserve Champion. The two rein Open Champion and the Two Rein Open Reserve Champion, an ERCHA Futurity Finalist in 2008, ERCHA Limited Open Champion and Reserve Champion, ERCHA Two Rein Open Reserve Champion, ERCHA Hackamore Open Champion in 2009 and many more Champion wins in the following 4 years.

Sarah Schneider Bellach - Hunter/Jumper Trainer

Growing up in the Bay Area, Sarah Schneider Bellach was fortunate to work with some of Northern California's top trainers. As a junior rider, Sarah enjoyed success in the Hunter, Jumper, and Equitation rings; earning numerous Championships and Top-Ten Medal Finals placings. After taking a couple years away from riding, Sarah transferred to Fresno State to join the Equestrian Team and feels her time at Fresno State (first as a student-athlete and, after graduating, as Assistant Coach) was instrumental in helping her develop her horsemanship philosophy. After leaving Fresno State, Sarah spent some time competing as an amateur before accepting a position as Assistant Trainer with Patrice Corbridge's Cottonwood Farm. Under Patrice's tutelage, Sarah spent time teaching, training, and competing with clients and their horses and was able to learn from working with one of California's most respected training teams. Sarah left Cottonwood Farm after the birth of her second child to focus on her family and keeps herself involved in the horse community by acting as an independent training consultant.

Susan Henderson-Perry - Horse Judging Trainer and Equine Nutritionist

B.S. and Master's Degree from Kansas State University in Animal Science and Industry.

Currently Susan works for Associated Feed as an Equine (Equus Feed) and Show Feed specialist. She works with farms, feed stores, FFA and 4-H groups to deliver the best nutrition possible to achieve her customers goals. For 20 years she was an Agriculture Teacher and coached 5 State FFA Horse Judging teams with 2 National wins and 1 reserve champion team. She also coached a State and National FFA Livestock Judging Team.

Mariya Pitel, DVM - Acupuncturist

Interacting with her aunt, who was a staff veterinarian at a large state-owned dairy, helped Mariya define her future career very early on.
